

7th Grade Supply List

Due to the ongoing health crisis, we are asking that students prepare themselves to be self-sufficient throughout the school year. While the overwhelming majority of work will be completed and submitted digitally, it is still our plan to use in-person learning to engage in previously proven methods of instruction. Typing definitions is a very good strategy, but it does not engage your muscle memory like handwriting does.

So as much as we can, we hope to have in-class learning be as normal as possible. Below is a list of all of the items we plan on using throughout the year. This covers all 7th grade classes, regardless of team or cohort.

Simple Pack (8ish?) of colored pencils, or other coloring utensils

- colored pencils are preferable, as they are neater and more accurate, however crayons or markers will suffice.

Pens/Pencils/Writing-Utensils

- Pens (Social Studies, Science, and ELA)
- Pencils (Math and ELA)
- Fine tip Sharpies (Social Studies)
- 1 or 2 Expo Markers (to use with provided portable whiteboards at desks)

Other Suggested General Supplies

- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- 2in. Binder with filler paper. You only need 1 total, for all classes.

Water Bottle

- Water Bubblers will not be available in the academic hallways, so it is suggested that every student bring their own water bottle. Reusable is much more friendly to the environment, but single use is much more sanitary. Please remember to recycle if you choose single use.

Hand-Sanitizer/Tissues

- Movement around class will be limited, so having some tissues and hand-sanitizer at your desk will be useful.

Technology

- Each student will have their own assigned chromebook, so there is no risk of contamination, however students can bring in their own mouse or headphones/earbuds if they wish. These will not be available from your teachers.

Teacher's Supplies

- As in most school years, the teachers do have a small supply of materials to lend out to students. Given the aforementioned health crisis, we are no longer allowed to accept items back. So, while we will have some material at the beginning of the year to share, they will go fast.
