A Message from the Superintendent:

The 2020-2021 school year has come to an end and our students once again had a great year academically and in their many activities they can participate in at North Platte.

Though it was a year with many adjustments to be made by students, staff, and parents, we believe that we were still able to provide a quality educational program for our students.

On May 23, an excited crowd watched 33 seniors graduate from North Platte. They consistently were a group that had strong participation and excelled in many areas of their academics and activities. They will be remembered as an outstanding class that represented the North Platte community well throughout their years in the district.

This past semester was one full of many great team performances by our high school students in their activities. We wrapped up our winter sports season with a state championship by our wrestling cooperative team with Mid-Buchanan. That was then followed by another state championship in the spring, this time by our Academic Bowl team. The memorable 2020-2021 sports year for North Platte concluded with a second place finish at the state track meet by our girls track team. We are very proud of our students and all that participated this past year in our many activities and their incredible accomplishments.

The North Platte Foundation Golf Tournament was recently held on June 11 at Shiloh Springs Golf Course in Platte City. The proceeds from this tournament directly benefit our students at North Platte by providing funds to generate scholarships for our graduates to utilize as they pursue their post-secondary education.

The summer is always a time for maintenance projects in the district, both large and small. Plans this summer include resealing the roofs over the high school gymnasium, the northwest corner of the older section of the junior high, and the choir room.

We also plan to reseal the parking lots at the Dearborn and Edgerton campuses. Other projects include a new scoreboard in the high school gym (through the Platte County Parks Outreach Grant), new wall mats in the high school gym (through funds raised from advertisements on the new scoreboard), adding another door to the bus shed at Dearborn, making an additional door connecting rooms for our special education department in the elementary, and various smaller projects.

We are hopeful that the 2021-2022 school year is a return to normal for all in the district. I have been asked many times about the district plans for the year. Much of that will be once again be dic-



tated by any direct orders or recommendations we receive from the Department of Health and the Platte County Health Department. The North Platte board lifted our mask mandate in mid-May, following the same action by the PC Health Department. We are not currently planning to offer the Panther Online option for the 2021-2022 school unless circumstances change between now and the start of school.

NEWS FROM THE SCHOOLS

Elementary

This school year was unique to say the least! We appreciate the support and patience the community has shown throughout this year. Our parents and students have rolled with the flow and made this school year work. The students finished the year strong.

In pre-school students enjoyed learning through exploration and play in early childhood. It brought much joy to watch each student become more capable each day! Every child leaves this school year with a stronger development of social-emotional skills, pre-academic knowledge, communication skills, and self help skills. We cherish the bonds and relationships we built this year.

The kindergarten classes have been very busy finishing their end of the year units and projects. These have included plants, insects, and dinosaurs. We have continued practicing our reading each day in small groups, whole class, and at home. Thank you for listening to your child read at home throughout the year. Please encourage your child to read and listen to you read throughout the summer. The libraries in our community have great resources and programs to encourage summer reading. The students have improved so much in their writing ability, and enjoyed researching insects and dinosaurs then writing about them. Our students completed math units for shapes, and money, as well

as, practicing addition and subtraction facts. A lot of practice and hard work was put in by the students preparing for their spring concert and graduation ceremony. They loved performing for all of their families and friends! Fun was had by all as we counted down the days using the alphabet letters. Favorites included Bubble Day, Teddy Bear Day, and Picnic Day!

First grade enjoyed a great fourth quarter. In reading, students continued to master their sight words and fluency. They have grown so much as readers this year. Parents, thank you for reading with your child throughout the school year. Please continue to read throughout the summer as well! In math, students have been working hard to master the addition and subtraction facts. We celebrated their hard work with a banana split party! The students enjoyed participating in the ABC Countdown for the end of school. We know these kids are ready for second grade next year!

Second grade had a fun and busy fourth quarter. They learned ways of being a good citizen and put their skills to good use by cleaning up litter in the park. They also learned about fractions, multiplication, and division. They took their knowledge of place value to the next level by working with the thousands place value. The second graders spent the quarter learning cursive. During the end of the year awards ceremony, those stu-

dents that mastered their cursive obtained their very own cursive license. Students practiced writing letters to their friends and even wrote a persuasive letter to Mrs. Goodlet. Their persuasive letter helped give ideas for the end of the year ABC countdown. Students learned about many similarities and differences of five Native American tribes. They wrote their very own nonfiction book about these tribes that included many text features. What really wrapped up the year was celebrating with the end of semester AR Bash. NPE students spent the last few weeks of school counseling brushing up on friendship and mindfulness skills. First grade students ended the year with a unit on mindfulness. They learned that mindfulness simply means focusing on what's happening in your mind, your heart, and your surroundings. They practiced calming breathing techniques, yoga moves, and other mindful strategies for calming big emotions. Second grade students received a sampling of both friendship and mindfulness. They learned some important

Our students have once again performed well in many areas of activities and assessments.
