

Return to Learning: "Yellow" Phase (Starting **TUESDAY** September, 22nd)

NOTE: We are only running AM bus routes starting **Tuesday**, September 22nd. This will be for **ALL kids**, AM & PM students will all be attending at the **SAME** time from 8:00 am - 12:00 pm.

Bus Routes: Mr. Ball & the drivers will be contacting bus riders on Monday, Sept. 21st to discuss pickup & drop off times.

MONDAY-THURSDAY:

ALL STUDENTS PK-6 8:00am-12:00pm

- All kids PK-6 onsite each day
- Elementary Schedule: Classes stay in cohorts, activity/mask breaks, specialist schedule (PE, music, library/tech) condensed

Students Grades 7-12 onsite 4 days per week with all students if possible (We will work with Lincoln County Health.)

- Busses run normal routes
- Students receive grab & go lunch before leaving school
- Teachers & paras will check-in with FULL online/at home students Monday-Thursday afternoons

FRIDAY:

Distance Learning for ALL students

- Teachers/staff check-in virtually or in-person with FULL online/at home students
- Opportunity for ALL students to receive additional in-person supports as needed by appointment

ALL students TK-12 will be attending school together from 8:00am-12:00 beginning Tuesday, September 22nd.

Unless otherwise directed from the health department, we will continue with this ½ day schedule each week Monday-Thursday, with Friday's continuing as distance learning days.

Bussing:

Busses will only pick up students in the morning, and return them home after school gets out at noon.

Walkers/Drop Off:

Please do not arrive or drop off your child prior to 7:50am each morning during our ½ day schedule.

Health Screening:

Our health screening process will continue to look very similar in this model.

- Elementary students will enter through the main elementary building doors, following the ramp to line up.
- Middle School students will enter through the main middle school building doors, lining up along the side of the middle school building.
- High School students can enter from either the tennis court side, or the horseshoe side.

Food Service:

Both breakfast and lunch will still be provided at no cost to **all** students who choose to take it in a “Grab & Go” style.

- Students grades TK-4 will have time provided by their teacher to eat in their classroom at the end of the ½ day. Those students will then grab breakfast for the next day on their way out the door to take home and eat the next morning.
- Students in grades 5-12 will grab their lunch as well as breakfast for the next day on their way out the door to take home and eat the next morning.

Note: As long as case counts remain at this level, we are hopeful to continue this ½ day schedule for all students for the near future. We are in consistent communication with the health department, and will work closely with them to determine if the cases rise if we would need to move back to our AM/PM PODS, or if they continue to remain low, move to the next step of our DSD return to learning phases.
