Demographics

Demographics Summary

Denton Creek works with students incarcerated by the Texas Juvenile Justice Department at the McFadden Ranch facility which is both a residential treatemnt facility and a halfway house located in Roanoke, Texas. Students come from all over the state of Texas. All students are considered at-risk. The campus is very diverse. The average enrollment for the past three years has been 91. The range of ages is from 15 to 18, with 16.5 being the mean. Over the past three years, the percentages of students with special needs has been in line with the rest of the secondary campuses in the district. However, studentss receiving 504 services is trending upward.

There are three fullt-time teachers. Each teacher is responsible for a core area, electives, and test preparation. Students are allowed to visit family on weekends. Some students work off campus. There is an active network of volunteers who work with the stduents residing at McFadden Ranch.

A strength of the campus is the distribution of ethnicities, with no particular major group being under or over-represented.

A second strength of the campus is that kids come from all over the state of Texas which brings the unique characteristics of numerous communities to each

classroom.

Student Academic Achievement

Student Academic Achievement Summary

Denton Creek is in the process of transformation. Denton Creek now emphasizes more online instruction for original credit, more opportunities for credit recovery, more access to electives, the opportunity to earn work-related certifications, and intensive GED preparation for selected stduents.

Student Academic Achievement Strengths

In 2018-2019, nine students earned GEDs. In 2017-2018, seven stduents earned GEDs. Already this year, two students have earned GEDs. Rarely does a stduent enroll with sufficient credits to successfully complete coursework fro a diploma. Of enrolling students, they seem to have enjoyed success on the STAAR Biology exam. Most students have multiple failed attempts in English and Algebra STAAR testing.

Perceptions

Perceptions Summary

Students come from all over the state of Texas. The average length of stay is about 60 days. Rarely does a student spend an entire year enrolled in school. All students enrolled are classified as at-risk for multiple reason. Strudture, cretaive behavior management, as well as academics, are equally addressed. It is our goal to provide the student with compwtencies that will promote academic, work, and social success upon their withdrawal.

Perceptions Strengths

Most students enroll with a history of profound anti-social condcut, as well as, severely interrupted academic histories. Overcoming their perceived lack of academic potential is a tremendous obstacle in most cases. Getting individuals to substitute teach is very difficult, probably because of the perceived difficulty in working with Denton Creek students and the plethora of alternative substitute opportunites at the other campuses.
